Dr. Daryl R. Hague received his JD from the University of Washington (1990), his MA from Brigham Young University (1996), and his PhD from Binghamton University (2002). Dr. Hague's interests include translation pedagogy, representations of translation in literature and film, legal translation, translation assessment, and literary translation. He has published articles in leading journals, and he has published many translations, both legal and literary. His first translation of a complete novel—*No One Weeps for Me Now*—will appear in spring 2022. The author, Nicaragua's Sergio Ramírez, is a leading voice in Spanish-language letters, having received the 2017 Cervantes Prize. This novel is the second in a series, and Dr. Hague is currently translating the series' next novel, *Tongolele no sabía bailar*, under the title *Dead Men Cast No Shadows*. This translation should be published in autumn 2022. Dr. Hague has served as the treasurer for ATISA since 2014.
